This bill includes red deer as a species of domesticated deer that may be raised for sale as venison and includes provisions to allow the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to declare other species eligible with the concurrence of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

SUMMARY

The bill provides that potentially sensitive information on plantings of certified seed potatoes has confidential status and is protected from the provisions of the freedom of access laws, except in case of subpoena in a criminal case or when needed to prosecute a violation of minimum planting standards.

The amendment adds an emergency preamble and clause and a provision that allows growers to authorize release of planting records.

Industry and provides funding for the study from industry contributions to various dedicated funds. This bill replaces LD 2022, a resolve creating a harness racing study that would have required General Fund revenues.

The bill permits the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources greater access to the records of persons receiving blueberry shipments for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with blueberry theft laws. The bill ensures that potentially sensitive business information available to the department or the Maine Blueberry Commission is kept confidential and is protected from the freedom of access laws.

SUMMARY

This bill, which was not referred to a committee, would have extended permission for any group or individual to use live animals in games if the animal's actions did not deviate from their natural behavior. Under current law only educational and cultural institutions or nonprofit service organizations may use live animals in games.
