This bi'l, as amended (S-631), suspends the implementation of any rule adopted by the Public Utilities Commission which requires the consideration of competitive bidding for construction of telephone facilities until January 1, 1991. The Public Utilities Commission shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities on or before January 1, 1991, concerning competitive bidding for construction of telephone facilities.
