SUMMARY

This bill was reported out by the Committee pursuant to joint order. The bill represents the majority report of the Committee regarding a general fund bond issue for correctional facilities. (See LD 2470). The bill authorizes a bond issue of \$20,250,000 for 100 new maximum—security beds in So. Warren, 50 community beds in Southern Maine, 2 restitution centers in Penobscot and Androscoggin Counties, 50 minimum—security beds at Downeast Correctional Center, a women's pre—release center in Hallowell and feasibility studies. The bill requires ratification by state—wide referendum.

Senate Amendment "A" adds a fiscal note to the bill.
