This bill extends the boundaries of the Presque Isle Water District and the Presque Isle Sewer District to the corporate boundaries of the City of Presque Isle. This bill was not referred to committee.

An Act to Validate and Ratify a Vote of the Town of Gray Concerning the Gray Water District P & S 136 EMERGENCY

SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 1985, chapter 110, provided that, upon submission to the voters of Gray for their approval at the next general election following passage of that Act, the territorial limits of the Gray Water District would be extended to include the entire town. The voters of Gray approved the boundary extension at a special town meeting with the result of 265 voters in favor and 149 against. Since it was approved at a special town meeting instead of a general town meeting, the legality of the vote has been questioned. This bill ratifies that vote and specifies that the approval is retroactive to the date of the vote and not the date of this ratification. This bill was not referred to committee.
