SUMMARY

This bill would have increased the state share percentage of the total allocation statewide from 55% to 60% and increased the guaranteed minimum state share of each school administrative unit's total allocation from 5% to 10%.

SUMMARY

This bill would have provided a different method of reducing the state subsidy to school administrative units that receive federal impact aid. It would have allowed each unit to retain a greater amount of federal impact aid to cover costs for those students above the subsidized amounts before subtracting any additional amounts from the state subsidy of the unit. Current law requires local units to subtract from the state subsidy an amount equal to the impact aid received, multiplied by a fraction equal to subsidizable costs in the base year divided by all costs in the base year.

SUMMARY

This bill appropriates \$11,320 to continue the Surname Index Project under the direction of the Maine State Library. The project is a largely volunteer project begun in 1970 to record, catalogue and index genealogical and historical data about early Maine settlers.

The Committee Amendment (H-113) increases the FY 91-92 appropriation to provide for the one-time costs of purchasing computer hardware and software for the project and adds an appropriation for FY 92-93 for personnel and supplies for the project. It is anticipated the project will take at least 2 years to complete.

SUMMARY

This bill requires school administrative units to provide a yearly statement of transition services needed by youths with disabilities as part of the transition from school to the community, including where appropriate, a statement of responsibilities of cooperating state agencies (Education, Human Services, Corrections, Labor, Mental Health and Mental Retardation). The bill makes state law consistent with the recently reauthorized federal Education of the Handicapped Act

The Committee Amendment (S-85) retains the original intent of the bill and clarifies that the statement of services must be provided for all youths with disabilities in transition who are 16 or older and enrolled in school and may be provided at a younger age. If the agreed-on transition services are not provided by any of the cooperating agencies, the amendment directs the school to reconvene the agencies and develop a strategy to provide the necessary services. The amendment also states that school administrative units are not responsible for providing noneducational services.

SUMMARY

This bill expanded the Blaine House Scholars Program to allow loans to be awarded to students in The bill authorized up to 15% of the funds available postbaccalaureate teacher certification programs. under the Blaine House Scholars Program to be used for these loans for 2 years and required the Finance Authority of Maine to make recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Education by January 1, 1992, to ensure the appropriate allocation of all the funds available for the program.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-75) fully incorporated into the Blaine House Scholars Program the new category of loans to students pursuing postbaccalaureate teacher certification created by the bill. The amendment defined those individuals who are eligible for loans under the new category and established the relationship between loans in the new category to other loans provided by the Blaine House Scholars Program. The amendment also established a flexible allocation of funds between the different types of Blaine House Scholars Program loans available and added a fiscal note.
