An Act to Establish a Statewide Area Health Education Centers System

SUMMARY

This bill formally links previously established components of Maine's health education network to create the Maine Area Health Education Centers System. The system, created under the auspices of the Finance Authority of Maine, governed by the Maine Area Health Education Centers Commission and housed at the University of New England College of Osteopathic Medicine is responsible for addressing the State's health care personnel needs, particularly for areas and populations that need additional health care services.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-253) was reported by a majority of the committee. The amendment removes the Area Health Education Centers System from the Finance Authority of Maine and places it directly within the University of New England College of Osteopathic Medicine. The amendment also makes several changes to clarify that existing health education programs are not required to become part of the system. It also changes the name and membership of the advisory body to the system and eliminates the authorization for expenses to its members. The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.

House Amendment "A" (H-311) was presented on behalf of the Committee on Bills in Second Reading to correct a technical error.

House Amendment "B" (H-420) clarifies the appointing authority for certain members of the Maine Area Health Education Centers Advisory Committee.

SUMMARY

The bill makes the consumption of alcohol or any substance containing alcohol or the use or any illegal drug while caring for children in a licensed or registered day care grounds for revocation of the day care license or registration.
