SUMMARY

This bill would have changed the date of primary elections in Maine from the 2nd Tuesday in June to the 2nd Tuesday in September, and would have correspondingly changed the dates for signing and filing primary petitions and nomination petitions for unenrolled candidates. See also LD 35.

SUMMARY

The bill removed the requirement that voters include the municipality of residence along with the name of any write-in candidates in municipal elections.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-86) permits voters in local elections to vote for a write-in candidate without including the municipality of residence of the candidate, but only in an election in which residency is arepsilonrequirement to hold the office. The amendment also adds a provision necessary to apply this rule to ballots as well as to nominating papers.

SUMMARY

This bill would have allowed law enforcement officers of the University of Maine System to enforce municipal parking ordinances in areas adjacent to university campuses. Instead of recommending passage of the bill, the committee sent a letter to Portland's mayor requesting that he work with the University of Southern Maine to alleviate parking problems in areas adjacent to that university.
