All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act to Facilitate the Participation of Community Hospitals in the Development of Mental Health Services

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

SUMMARY

This bill allows hospitals to proceed with the development of mental health services regardless of the size of the Hospital Development Account. Hospitals that receive certificates of need for mental health projects may develop them and receive adjustments to their financial requirements.

SUMMARY

Presently a private ambulatory surgical facility may not allow practitioners from outside the practice to use the facility without first obtaining a certificate of need from the Department of Human Services. The bill allows a private ambulatory facility to contract with outside practitioners without being subject to the certificate of need law.

SUMMARY

This bill increases the fee for obtaining a marriage license from \$10 to \$50, and earmarks the increase to fund domestic violence programs through the Department of Human Services. Three dollars of the increase is kept by the collecting municipality to cover administrative costs. A fee waiver is provided for those who can not afford the license fee.

Committee Amendment "B" (H-179) removes the provision from the original bill that limits the expenditure of funds to the operation of shelters or safe homes, allowing domestic violence programs to use the funds for outreach and other services. It also decreases the marriage license fee from \$50, as proposed in the original bill, to \$45 and allows municipalities to retain a larger share of the increase. The original bill's fee-waiver provision is eliminated. The amendment also increases the fee for the first copy of a birth, marriage or death certificate from \$5 to \$10. It also adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

Senate Amendment "C" (S-121) amends Committee Amendment "B" by removing the dedication of the marriage license fee increase and depositing the increased revenue to the General Fund.
