SUMMARY

This bill requires that if the Department of Human Services requires that a child receive counseling or other medical services as an alternative to initiating a child protection proceeding against the parents and the child's parents do not have insurance coverage for such services, the Department of Human Services is responsible for providing them.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-81) requires the Department of Human Services to inform the person responsible for a child, when the department requires mental health or medical services as an alternative to a child protective proceeding, that the services must be approved by the department. The amendment also clarifies the requirement in the original bill regarding when the department must pay for those services. The amendment adds an appropriation to the bill.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-429) removes the appropriation from the bill.

The bill was enacted as amended but has not been signed by the Governor. Final resolution of the bill has yet to be determined.
