#### An Act to Recriminalize Intoxication

The bill would have reinstated the crime of public intoxication, making it a Class E crime to appear in a public place while intoxicated. It would have permitted law enforcement officers to release the person when the person is no longer intoxicated.

#### **SUMMARY**

The bill would have allowed the Department of Transportation to use proprietary information about contractors and consultants for its review but protect this proprietary information from being made available to the public.

#### SUMMARY

The bill deals with unaccepted streets or so-called paper streets. The bill would have amended the law to provide that title to property taken for town ways is not required to be in fee simple absolute if the property includes a paper street and public rights in the property have not been terminated pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 3031, subsection 1, section 3032 or 3033. The bill would have allowed municipalities under certain circumstances to assign rights-of-way to landowners abutting paper streets.

#### **SUMMARY**

The bill extends the scope of the power of sale law to encompass all mortgages securing commercial loans, except that the power of sale may not be used to foreclose on the principal dwelling of a mortgagor who is a natural person.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-142) revises the bill to make the power of sale apply to all mortgages securing loans that are primarily for business, commercial or agricultural purposes and that are extended to partnerships and trusts, as well as those to corporations. It also provides that a properly incorporated power of sale is not affected by the transfer of the property to an entity or individual other than a corporation, partnership or trust. The power of sale cannot be used to foreclose on the primary residence of a mortgagor who is a natural person.

#### SUMMARY

The bill repeals the law conferring immunity from prosecution to witnesses in restraint of trade or commerce cases. The bill clarifies that costs of suit are recoverable by the Attorney General in injunctive actions as they are also recoverable in damage action. The bill adds language imposing ciwil penalties for contempt of a court order, similar to the language that exists currently in the parallel provisions of the Unfair Trade Practices Act, Title 5, section 209. The bill increases the civil penalty to \$100,000 and further conforms the civil penalty provision to the language existing in the parallel provisions in the Unfair Trade Practices Act, Title 5, section 209. The bill applies the investigative provisions of Title 10, section 1107 to inquiries by the Attorney General concerning mergers and acquisitions under Title 10, section 1102-A.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-126) deletes from the bill the requirement that the Attorney General recover the costs of an antitrust proceeding.
