This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

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SUMMARY

This bill provides the current services allocations from the Highway Fund and certain other funds for FY 1991-92 and 1992-93. The first year allocation is approximately \$361,250,000 with 1,967 positions (legislative count), distributed as follows. The second year has the same number of positions with an allocation of approximately \$407,000,000.

Committee Amendment "B" (H-735) does the following.

Part A establishes the Highway Fund current services budget.

Part B of the amendment makes deallocations from the Highway Fund in the amount of approximately \$8,441,000 to support reduction proposals and adjustments in the Departments of Administration, Public Safety and Transportation. Part B also makes allocation from the Highway Fund in the amount of approximately \$27,000 for approved reclassifications and range changes in the Departments of Public Safety, Secretary of State and Transportation.

Part C of the amendment allocates funds for the 2 cent per gallon increase in the gasoline tax in the amount of \$2,300,000 for FY 1991-92. Part C adjusts allocations to the Secretary of State and the Department of Transportation. An allocation is also made to fund the Scarborough Interchange project.

Part C also makes adjusting allocation due to the overbudgeting of health benefits and adjustments to the payroll in the Departments of Administration, Finance, Public Safety, Secretary of State and Transportation.

Part D increases the fee for the trip permit granted by the Secretary of State in lieu of special fuel tax licensing and reporting from \$5 to \$50. Part D also increases the excise tax on gasoline by 2 cents per gallon and sunsets on July 1, 1993.

A Class E crime is established in Part D for misuse of tax-exempt home heating fuel as motor fuel, with a minimum fine of \$250. Part D also establishes a minimum fine of \$250 for failure to file a special fuel tax license application and other violations connected with the special fuel use tax.

Clarifying language for the lease-purchase financing arrangement of the Division of Motor Vehicle's building and new language requiring that the repayment of the Highway Fund must occur through increased gas taxes are included in Part D.

Lastly, Part D establishes the funding ratio for the Bureau of State Police and adds a provision to the bill allowing the Department of Transportation to expend funds on the unimproved portion of Baxter State Park road.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "B" (H-751) added a provision to repeal this Act on July 11, 1991.
