SUMMARY

Developers often are required by the Department of Environmental Protection to build highway improvements as a part of project approval. This bill allows the Department of Transportation to authorize developers, under certain conditions, to make those improvements on highways under the Department's jurisdiction. The bill also allows the Department of Transportation to accept private funds to accomplish needed transportation improvements as part of the Department's program.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-280) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

House Amendment "A" (H-506) clarifies that this bill grants immunity notwithstanding the Maine Tort Claims Act.
