SUMMARY

This bill proposed to authorize the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to issue moose hunting permits as necessary to maintain moose populations in balance with available habitat. The present law allows no more than 1,000 permits to be issued.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to establish a minimum liability insurance coverage for commercial whitewater outfitters of \$500,000.

This bill proposed to prohibit affiliated outfitters from operating on any rapidly flowing river. An affiliated outfitter is an outfitter which has a defined financial or business interest in another outfitter.

This bill proposed to require that the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife set aside 10% of the recreational use limit on rapidly flowing rivers for noncommercial public use; at present the department may set aside up to that amount based on demand for noncommercial public use.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the use of gill nets by the Penobscot Nation tribal biologists for the purpose of scientific fisheries research and management. The bill requires the Nation to submit reports of it use of gill nets to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The bill proposed to require the Nation to submit annual reports regarding its use of gill nets to the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife. The bill proposed a sunset provision to require the committee to submit a report to the legislature evaluating the advisability of the continued use of gill nets by the Nation.

The committee amendment (H-390) limits the authority of the Penobscot Nation in its use of gill nets to waters within, flowing through or adjacent to Penobscot Indian territory. This amendment removes the

requirement that the Penobscot Nation make an annual report to the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife. This amendment also strikes the sunset clause.
