### **SUMMARY**

This resolve authorized the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands to convey the State's interest in a parcel of land in the Town of Oxford to Richard E. Varney and Barbara E. Varney.

Committee Amendment "A" removed the emergency preamble and the emergency clause and required that the petitioning owners of the property, Richard E. Varney and Barbara E. Varney, pay \$250 to cover the costs associated with the transfer of the title and were responsible for the preparation of the transfer documents. It also added a fiscal note.

### SUMMARY

This bill required sheriffs' departments to give priority to patrolling rural areas.

Committee Amendment "A" required that the county sheriff patrol areas in the county that have no local law enforcement.

House Amendment "D" amended the committee amendment by requiring that to the extent the sheriff undertakes to patrol, the sheriff shall patrol those areas in the county that have no local law enforcement.
