JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1178 An Act to Improve Outdoor Lighting

SUMMARY

This bill prohibited the use of state funds for installing or repairing any permanent outdoor lighting system unless the system conformed to minimum design standards. After January 1, 2000, state funds could not be used to operate any outdoor lighting system unless the system conformed to the standards established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1768. The Director of the Bureau of Public Improvements was required to adopt rules to implement this section by January 1, 1992.

The bill also prohibited municipalities from installing permanent outdoor roadway luminaries unless the Director of the Bureau of Public Improvements determined that the purpose of the lighting can not be achieved by other means. The Attorney General was empowered to seek injunctive relief against municipalities that do not comply with the lighting standards established in this bill.

Committee Amendment "A" retained the bill's assignment of responsibility for building lighting to the Bureau of Public Improvements but made the Department of Transportation responsible for administering lighting standards on state highways and state aid highways. The section requiring municipalities to conform with the proposed lighting standards was deleted, and an appropriation section and a fiscal note were added to the bill.

House Amendment "A" clarified a provision in the committee amendment regarding illuminance standards for permanent outdoor luminaries installed with state funds and struck provisions that prohibited the use of state funds for the operation of nonconforming luminaries. The amendment also struck the appropriation section and replaced the fiscal note.

SUMMARY

This bill directed the Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System to urge domestic corporations in which the State or the Maine State Retirement System have investments and that have operations in Northern Ireland to adopt employment practices, known as the MacBride Principles, that are designed to reduce discrimination in employment. The bill required the Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System to prepare a list of all domestic corporations in Northern Ireland in which the Treasurer of State or the board had invested and to use that list as the basis for determining which domestic corporations doing business in Northern Ireland were subject to the disinvestment provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1962, subsection 3. The list had to be prepared by January 1993, and disinvestment became effective on July 1, 1994.

Senate Amendment "B" replaced the original bill. It required the Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System to report annually on their efforts to implement the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1955 and added a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

This bill clarified that boards of appeal need not create a written transcript of every proceeding; they may create a transcript or tape record the hearing, but are not required to do either. They are required to keep a written record and reduce their decisions to writing. The bill also clarified the deadline for motions to reconsider and take action, and extended the appeal period to 45 days to allow extra time in case there is a reconsideration.

House Amendment "A" added a fiscal note to the bill.
