This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill established that the ability to obtain work which is a reasonable commuting distance from the employee's community disqualifies an injured employee who has attained maximum medical improvement from benefits. It placed on the employer the burden of showing capacity to work and ability to obtain work within a reasonable daily commute from the employee's community.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill deleted the 400 week rule from the Workers' Compensation Act and provided for payments to continue no more than 400 weeks after maximum medical improvement after a commission finding of 50% or less incapacity. Periods of greater than 50% incapacity were not counted in the 400 week maximum. There was an exception for subsequent periods of incapacity from the injury of greater than 50%.

#### SUMMARY

This bill required employers in the State who receive economic subsidies from the State to give a hiring preference to their existing employees whenever new employment positions are created by the employer. The bill required the employer to hire an existing employee if that employee is qualified to do the job and no better qualified applicant exists. The preference could not, however, conflict with any collective bargaining agreement applicable to the employer.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-230) removed investment tax credits from the definition of economic subsidies and added a fiscal note.

#### SUMMARY

This bill required all service providers in the Maine Job Training System to give priority to teenage parents in accepting applicants to all state and federal education and training programs administered by the Department of Labor and providing services to the participants.
