JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

Committee Amendment "A" ((H-450) changes the method of reduction of benefits for beneficiaries of members dying before reaching 60 years of age from an actuarial reduction to the method currently provided in statute for members retiring early. The amendment also makes technical changes to effectively accommodate the delayed effective date of July 1, 1993 for the substantive provisions of the bill and adds a fiscal note.

This bill establishes the Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System to provide pension and death benefits for member firefighters.

This bill was carried over to the Second Regular Session.

SUMMARY

This bill changes the date for certain school secretaries of irrevocable election of the Maine State Retirement System from January 1, 1991 to July 1, 1991. This was necessary as The Social Security System will recognize school secretaries to be part of the Social Security System as of July 1, 1991. The original date of irrevocable election was January 1, 1991. School secretaries choosing retirement coverage through the Maine State Retirement System prior to January 1, 1991 are ineligible for the social security coverage unless the date is changed.

SUMMARY

This bill repeals the language that requires veterans to serve in the Armed Forces during a period of conflict, to be eligible to be a resident in a veterans' home or to be buried at the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery. Currently, a veteran must have served in the United States Armed Forces during a period of conflict to be eligible to be a resident in Maine Veterans' Homes and to be buried at the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.

Committee Amendment "B" (minority report) (H-588) deletes from the bill provisions relating to access to the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery. It also permits the Maine Veterans' Homes to admit veterans who did not serve during wartime, if space is available, provided that veterans who served during wartime are given priority.

The bill died in nonconcurrence.

SUMMARY

This bill requires that the benefit reduction for any spouse be taken from the retiree's full benefit and does not change the requirement that the reduction for each spouse be calculated on the same basis.

SUMMARY

This bill provides that workers' compensation commissioners who were appointed judges between July 1, 1983 and December 1, 1984 are entitled, without further contribution, to credit in the Maine Judicial Retirement System for their creditable service as members of the Maine State Retirement System prior to July 1, 1983 and for service as commissioners from July 1, 1983 to November 30, 1984.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-208) adds an appropriation and a fiscal note to the bill.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-170) (not adopted) was printed in error and should have been printed as an amendment to a different bill.
