This bill would have created a special license plate for rescue unit workers and emergency medical services' personnel. It also provided for a \$50 forfeiture for failure by inactive rescue workers to return recalled license plates to the Secretary of State.

This bill would have prohibited the operation of a radio, loudspeaker or other auxiliary device on or in a vehicle in a manner that causes annoyingly loud noises. This restriction would not have applied to political speech.

SUMMARY

This bill would have allowed the use of dealer registration plates while driving vehicles to auction sites and while transporting dealership personnel to meetings related to training and the operation of the dealership.

This bill would have repealed the law regarding the inspection standards for a catalytic converter.
