SUMMARY

This bill would have provided funds to the Department of Education to fully fund special education costs of out-of-district placements above 3 times the secondary foundation per pupil operating costs.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes a process for the assignment of teachers and the protection of collective bargaining rights upon dissolution of a union school.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-540) replaces the original bill and establishes a process for dissolution of a union school and for withdrawal by a municipality from a union school that parallels the dissolution and withdrawal provisions for school administrative districts and consolidated school districts.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-764) adds language exempting the public hearing and election provisions from the municipal mandate laws.

SUMMARY

This bill would have guaranteed that each school administrative unit in the State receive compensation for its current year special education costs on a monthly basis. Compensation for special education costs would have equalled the unit's most recent monthly special education expenditure, multiplied by the average statewide state share percentage of program costs in the current year.

It would have also increased the State's share of special education costs to 100% effective July 1, 2000 and added a provision for paying 1991-92 school year special education costs to school units over a 5-year period, beginning in July 1994.
