SUMMARY

This bill would have provided the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System with more autonomy under the laws governing the Maine State Retirement System in matters relating to personnel employed by the system. The proposed changes would not have affected the benefits or the standing of the employees under the civil service laws and rules or collective bargaining contracts.

SUMMARY

This bill would have changed the state budget process, fiscal policy and fiscal accountability by:

- 1. Increasing the Maine Rainy Day Fund ceiling from \$25,000,000 to 5% of the General Fund;
- 2. Requiring an annual summary on state fiscal affairs and the budget;
- 3. Requiring full disclosure of state revenue and spending assumptions and methodology;
- 4. Requiring a 5-year projection of fiscal impacts of the state budget;
- 5. Requiring expanded information on the actual and projected cost of major programs;
- 6. Establishing the Maine Council of Economic Advisors; and
- 7. Establishing the Special Commission to Study the Organization of State Government Including Operational Cost Controls and Delivery of Services to conduct a cost-management efficiency study of State Government including a study of governmental organization and the delivery of programs and services.
