SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the First Regular Session. It provides a retirement system administered by the Maine State Retirement System for volunteer firefighters whose fire departments meet certain training requirements. The benefit would be available at age 60 and would be based on the number of years of qualified service.

The Committee Amendment makes technical changes and provides for funding through an additional tax on fire insurance premiums.
