This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill makes changes in workers' compensation law. It establishes a medical coordinator and a system of independent medical examiners. It caps attorneys' fees in lump sum settlements. It formalizes the procedures for filing medical reports and specifies the penalties for failure to file in a timely fashion. In permanent partial incapacity cases, it substitutes 520 weeks of benefits for 400 weeks after maximum medical improvement. It allocates money for workplace health and safety training. Rulemaking is provided regarding the duties of insurance adjusters, credits for qualifying safety programs dividends in the safety pool and credits for expanding the percentage of business in the voluntary market. Medical expense deductibles must be offered to smaller employers and are mandatory for larger employers.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-766) deletes the nonduplication of benefits provision.

House Amendment "A" (H-768) disqualifies for the position of independent medical examiner a physician who has examined an employee at the request of an insurance company or employers under workers' compensation law in the previous 52 weeks.

House Amendment "B" (H-769) requires an employee to pay for the work search expenses of the employee looking for work after the employer has provided a section 55-B list of positions.

House Amendment "C" (H-770) provides that the insurance provisions on modification factors, safety consultations and credits and other workers' compensation insurance changes take effect on 1/1/92. All provisions not otherwise provided for all apply to injuries or after the effective date of the act.

House Amendment "G" (H-774) amends 39 MRSA §52-B to clarify that the fee schedule applies to physicians.

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
