This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the far right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1902 An Act to Establish a Professional Standards Board for Maine Teachers

SUMMARY

This bill was introduced in the 1st Session and carried over to the 2nd Session by the committee. The bill establishes the Professional Standards Board for Educators which is charged with the responsibility of licensing teachers and administrators and approving educator preparation programs. The board consists of 13 members appointed by the Governor subject to Legislative approval, including 7 teachers, 3 administrators, 2 representatives of educator preparation programs and one public member. Educator licenses granted by the board would eventually replace educator certificates issued by the State Board of Education and the Department of Education. Fees are established for licenses issued by the board.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1223) retains the concept of a professional licensing board for educators from the bill but narrows its application to the licensure of teachers and approval of postsecondary teacher preparation programs. Several technical changes are made to clarify the organization of the Professional Standards Board for Teachers, the implementation of professional licensing requirements for teachers and teacher education approval programs beginning January 1, 1993, the treatment of funds collected for licenses and program approval by the board and the transition from a certification process by the State Board of Education to licensure by the Professional Standards Board for Teachers.

The House Amendment (H-1289) strikes the requirement that members of the board appointed by the Governor be approved by the Legislature.

Senate Amendment (S-687) increases the licensure fee for active teachers to \$50 making the fee for all licenses issued by the board the same.

Senate Amendment (S-741) corrects a conflicting provision in the Committee Amendment, makes a technical correction and corrects the fiscal note.

LD 1994 An Act Regarding the Repayment of Blaine House Scholarships PUBLIC 664

SUMMARY

Committee Amendment "A" (S-541) replaces the original bill. The amendment adds an emergency preamble to permit the Finance Authority of Maine to immediately issue loan deferments to eligible recipients of a Blaine House Scholars loan.

The amendment corrects an error in the statute created by conflicting amendments enacted during the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature.

The amendment allows the Chief Executive Officer of the Finance Authority of Maine to grant a one-year deferment to a recipient of a Blaine House Scholars loan for general postsecondary education or preservice teacher preparation who intends to teach in a public or private school approved for tuition purposes but has been unable to find such employment. No more than 5 one-year deferments may be authorized for a recipient.

The amendment allows the Chief Executive Officer of the Finance Authority of Maine to grant a one-year deferment to a recipient of a Blaine House Scholars loan for teachers or postbaccalaureate teacher certification who intends to teach in a public or private school approved for tuition purposes but has been unable to find such employment. No more than 5 one-year deferments may be authorized for a recipient.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

LD 2000 An Act to Amend the Laws Concerning Certification of PUBLIC 682 Educational Personnel

SUMMARY

The original bill contains provisions to facilitate the issuance of Maine professional teaching certificates to qualified, experienced out-of-state teachers moving to Maine to teach.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-558) retains those provisions and amends other sections to accommodate issuance of professional teaching certificates to out-of-state teachers. The amendment also directs the Commissioner of Education to conduct a study of the appeals process for persons whose application for certification or endorsement is denied or whose certification or endorsement is revoked or voided. The commissioner is required to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education by January 1, 1993.

The amendment directs the State Board of Education to review the status of out-of-field teaching restrictions and present a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education by January 1993.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

LD 2028 An Act to Clarify Municipal Approval of Payments of Public UNSIGNED School Funds and Awards of Hardship Fund Assistance

SUMMARY

The original bill clarifies that once municipal officers have voted to appropriate money for public schools for educational purposes, those officers can not then deny payment upon proper presentation of a bill or invoice.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1116) establishes guidelines for creation of a hardship fund to assist communities facing hardship due to reductions in general purpose aid during the 1991-92 school year. The amendment authorizes the Commissioner of Education to adopt rules for operation of the fund. The amendment also adds a new title and a fiscal note to the bill.
