### **SUMMARY**

The Boothbay Harbor Sewer District charter contains provisions that limit the total amount of outstanding debt of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District and allow for a special district meeting to authorize borrowing to finance certain expenditures and improvements in excess of \$50,000. This bill increases the district's debt limit to \$5,500,000, an amount that enables the district to borrow for a wastewater treatment facility in order to comply with state and federal wastewater discharge laws. It also gives the trustees discretion, without calling a district meeting, to borrow for certain capital expenditures that do not exceed \$150,000.

The committee amendment (H-953) adds a referendum clause. The Senate amendment (S-567) amends the referendum clause to address a technical error contained in an already printed Town Warrant.
