SUMMARY

This Resolution was referred to and reported out of the Appropriations Committee. However, since the issues involved are of unusually significant consequence to the Fisheries and Wildlife Committee, it is included here.

This Resolution proposes an amendment to the Constitution of Maine. The amendment requires that appropriations in any fiscal year to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (or successor agency responsible for noncommercial fisheries and wildlife management) be no less than the amount of revenues collected by the department pursuant to the laws administered by the department. The proposed constitutional amendment makes an exception for the allocation of federal monies and also makes an exception for any special funds which the Legislature creates (such as the nongame fund), provided that revenues placed in special funds must be used only for the purposes of the special funds and may not be diverted for other purposes.

The Resolution is subject to approval by the voters in a referendum to be held in November of 1992.

Committee Amendment A (H-1102) adds a fiscal note.
