This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the far right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill directed the State Harness Racing Commission to establish a medication program permitting the use of specified drugs and medicines for the therapeutic treatment of race horses. It provided for registration of horses in a treatment program and prohibition from racing for a designated period of time. See LD 2087.

SUMMARY

This bill allows the sale of common pari-mutuel pools of simulcast races held outside of the State.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-948) adds a fiscal note to the bill. House Amendment "A" (H-978) changes the age a person may be near a betting window or other place for accepting wagers from 16 to 18 years of age.

SUMMARY

The original bill proposed an annual registration fee of \$5 per gas pump nozzle for commercial fuel dispensers.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1004) changed the registration fee for commercial motor fuel dispensers to \$8 per dispensing nozzle. It requires the registration of commercial motor fuel dispensers, provides for the state sealer to collect all registration fees and establishes an account and a procedure for payment back to local sealers. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

The original bill was entitled "An Act Concerning the Structure and Operation of the Seed Potato Board."

ONTP

It proposed increasing the number of members appointed to the Seed Potato Board from 8 to 9 and also made the Director of the Division of Plant Industry a member of the board. The bill would have increased the board's administrative authority including the authority to enter into contracts and to purchase services, supplies and equipment outside of the state bidding and review process. Employees of the board would not be in a state employee bargaining unit under the provisions of the original bill.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-1150) increased the number of appointed members of the Seed Potato Board to 11. It specified that members on the board must represent the various sectors of the potato industry. This amendment provided that full-time and part-time employees of the board, with the exception of the program director, would be subject to the Civil Service Law. It specified that, after July 1, 1992, full-time employees would be employed based on a 40-hour workweek. In addition, this amendment repealed the sunset on penalties for violations of pesticide laws and also added a fiscal note to the bill.

House Amendment "B" replaced the committee amendment, retaining only that section that repeals the sunset on penalties for violations of pesticide laws. House Amendment "B" changed the title of the bill to "An Act to Repeal the Sunset on Penalties for Violations of Pesticide Laws."
