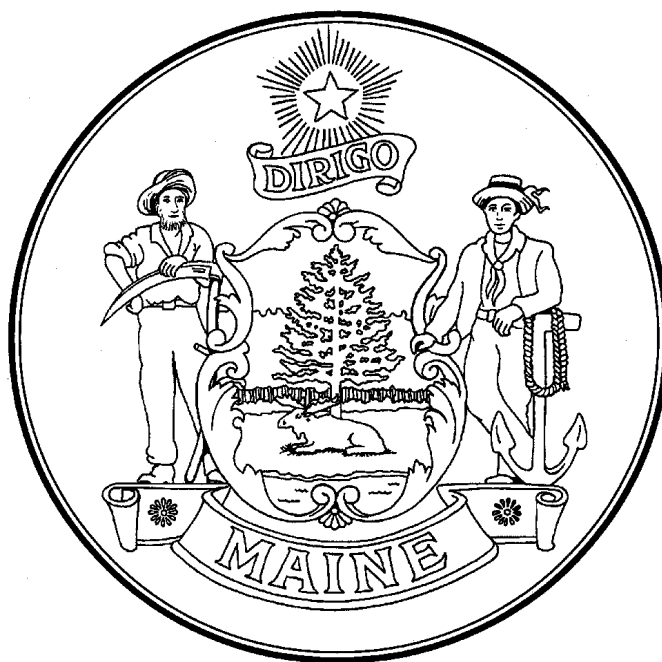

This bill authorized the Town of Rockport to issue and sell temporary general obligation bond anticipation notes for an additional year for the refinancing of certain outstanding temporary notes.

SUMMARY

This bill established the Washington County Budget Advisory Committee.

Senate Amendment A (S-628) exempted the bill from the state mandate provisions of Title 30-A §5684. This bill was engrossed without reference.
