This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the far right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

Part C of the bill directs the Department of Labor to study innovative uses of unemployment insurance compensation funds to encourage unemployed workers to return to work and employers to create and retain jobs.

Part D of the bill creates a comprehensive long-term planning process for economic growth. Part D establishes:

- 1. A process for developing and updating the State's long-term plan for economic growth, an effort to be conducted jointly between State Government, the educational system and the private sector;
- 2. A structure within State Government to coordinate the delivery of economic development and business assistance services outlined in the long-term plan; and
- 3. A continuing process to evaluate the extent to which the goals and strategies of the long-term plan have been accomplished, including the coordination effort.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-740) replaces the fiscal note to the bill to indicate possible loss of revenue to the General Fund resulting in the changes the bill makes in the Maine Seed Capital Tax Credit Program.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill authorizes a bond issue, in the amount of \$9,985,000, to be used to fund tuition for unemployed Maine citizens enrolled as full-time students in eligible training programs offered by the Maine Technical College System. The bond authorization will be submitted to the voters in November for approval.

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
