#### JULY 1993

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill provides for the reapportionment of the Board of School Directors of Maine School Administrative District No. 72 in accordance with a Method B (Weighted Voting) reapportionment plan adopted by a local reapportionment committee established under Title 20-A, section 1255. The plan provides for one additional director from Fryeburg and one fewer director from Lovell.

House Amendment "A" adds a mandate preamble and a fiscal note to the bill.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill adds to the powers and duties of the State Board of Education by requiring the board to develop a long-range plan for submission to the Legislature and by requiring an advisory council to develop standards for learning outcomes.

Committee Amendment "A" replaces the bill. The amendment establishes the Task Force on Learning Results and charges the task force with developing long-range educational goals and standards for school performance and student performance based on learning results. The task force must recommend to the State Board of Education a plan for achieving those goals and standards. The amendment also adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
