This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act to Revise and Recodify the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29

SUMMARY

This bill repeals the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29 and replaces that Title with a new Title 29-A, which is both a revision and a recodification of the prior law, pursuant to Resolve 1987, chapter 33. Part A of the bill contains the text of the new Title. Part B of the bill contains recodified portions of former Title 29 that are placed in appropriate sections of other existing Titles.

This bill proposed to amend the laws on motor vehicle registration to add language that was removed in Public Law 1987, chapter 117. Under this bill, if an applicant for registration certified that a motor vehicle had not been operated on a public way during the period of the expired registration, then the renewal registration would be for one year from the month that renewal registration was issued.
