An Act to Establish the Child Assistance Demonstration Program

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Child Assistance Demonstration Program as an alternative to the federal Aid to Families with Dependent Children Program to better assist families with child support orders to achieve economic independence. The Child Assistance Demonstration Program must be approved under the waiver provisions of the United States Social Security Act, Section 1115 before it can take effect.

SUMMARY

This bill provides for disclosure of basic information, such as diagnosis, medication, side effects of medication and likely consequences of failure to take medication, to family members or care givers who live with and care for people with mental illness who are clients of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. The bill permits disclosure only when a care giver lives with a client or provides care that prevents serious deterioration in that client's condition, the care giver makes a written request for the disclosure and the disclosure is in the best interests of the client.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT A (H-805) clarifies that persons permitted to release information under the bill are licensed mental health professionals. The amendment also allows clients to refuse requests for information and directs the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to establish an appeal process that may be used by persons who are denied access to information. The department is directed to work with consumers, providers, family members and advocates in developing the appeal process and other rules needed to implement the law. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

HOUSE AMENDMENT A (H-930) clarifies the appointment procedure by which the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation appoints the members of the advisory committee established to assist the Department in establishing rules. It also prohibits the members of the advisory committee from receiving reimbursement of expenses or legislative per diem.
