This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act to Provide Equitable Treatment of Electric Utility LD 1042 **Conservation Costs**

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to add a subsection to the Electric Rate Reform Act to require the Public Utilities Commission to adjust an electric utility's rates to recover revenues lost due to conservation, provided the revenue loss is not otherwise reflected in rates for the utility.

The bill also proposed to repeal the law that authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to restore revenues lost by an electric utility due to the economy, weather and conservation. The effects of the economy and the weather on an electric utility's revenues would continue to have been subject to traditional utility rate-making principles.

The bill further proposed to terminate the rate-adjustment mechanism currently in place for Central Maine Power Company ("ERAM") and to require that revenues recovered by Central Maine Power Company under ERAM would be limited to the \$8,000,000 already in rates and the amount of revenue lost due to conservation and demand-side measures commencing March 1, 1992.

SUMMARY

This bill requires the Public Utilities Commission to establish a 70% rate discount for calls to persons who are hard-of-hearing. The bill also enables certified deaf users of the vocal relay service to take advantage of the 70% discount when making credit-card calls. This bill adopts a recent recommendation of the Telecommunications Relay Services Advisory Council, established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 8704. This bill also incorporates recommendations by the advisory council concerning the appropriate words to use when referring to persons who are hard-of-hearing.

The committee amendment (H-345) requires the Public Utilities Commission, rather than the Department of Human Services to approve the form of affidavits filed with utilities by hearing or speech impaired persons pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 7302.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to eliminate the E-9-1-1 Advisory Committee and the Telecommunications Relay Services Advisory Council.

ONTP

This bill was submitted in compliance with Public Law 1991, chapter 844, section 8, which requires the Secretary of State to submit legislation repealing all advisory boards and commissions listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 12004-I and 12004-J as well as other advisory boards and commissions with similar functions.

Pursuant to that law, the boards and commissions were grouped by the subject areas within the jurisdiction of each joint standing committee and each special select committee. This bill proposed to repeal the boards identified within the jurisdiction of the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities.

LD 1119 An Act to Deregulate Consumer-owned Electric Utilities CARRIED OVER

SUMMARY

This bill proposes to allow consumer-owned electric utilities with elected boards to choose to regulate themselves and to be relieved of payment of the regulatory assessment.
