This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill doubles the amount of service fees charged by municipalities for certain services. LD 1004 is a related bill.

The House amendment (H-602) deletes the increase in municipal clerk fees that are paid by municipalities and reduces the increases in fees for issuing a copy of a record of birth, marriage or death, a copy of an amended birth record and a certificate of birth, marriage or death. The amendment also requires that additional revenue collected as a result of this legislation accrue to the municipality.

LD 1247 An Act to Implement the Constitutional Amendment Requiring ONTP the State to Fund Mandates

SUMMARY

This bill provides enabling legislation to implement the provisions of Constitutional Resolution 1991, chapter 2, which prohibits unfunded state mandates. The bill defines some of the terms used in the constitutional amendment. LD's 779 and 885 are related bills.

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits state agencies from purchasing products or services from corporations that do business in Northern Ireland and have not implemented the fair employment practices of the MacBride Principles.

The committee amendment (H-543) replaces the original bill. It removes the reference to the MacBride Principles and instead uses fair employment principles, which closely follow the MacBride Principles with the exception that protection to and from the workplace is removed. The amendment requires contractors for service to stipulate that they will make a good faith attempt to abide by the intent of the fair employment principles. This amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.

LD 1255 RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of ONTP Maine Providing for the Direct Election of the Attorney General and the Secretary of State
