The committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### SUMMARY

This bill would have amended the laws governing the Maine Overboard Discharge Assistance Program, which provides for assistance to homeowners whose faulty wastewater systems are discharging directly into surface waters. The bill would have allowed use of program funds, if funding becomes available, for a faulty or substandard residential wastewater system that results in any discharge. The program would have been administered by the Maine State Housing Authority. The committee amendment added a fiscal note and made several technical drafting changes.

LD 1686 proposed to exempt publicly owned treatment works from those portions of the Board of Environmental Protection's surface water toxics control program that differ from or are more stringent than the requirements established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under the Federal Water Pollution Act. also known as the "Clean Water Act."
