All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. SUMMARY

Current law requires that the Legislature establish the maximum debt service limit for the next biennium. The bill accomplishes that requirement by establishing the debt service limits for fiscal year 1996-97 and fiscal year 1997-98 at \$69,000,000.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-430) reduced the debt service limit for fiscal year 1996-97 and fiscal year 1997-98 to \$67,000,000, thereby maintaining the current debt service limit. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

SUMMARY

Federal law requires each state to designate a state postsecondary review entity, or SPRE, to develop review standards to be utilized in determining eligibility for participation in federal student aid programs for those institutions in each state that are referred to the state by the federal Secretary of Education. This bill provides the statutory base for the Department of Education to serve as the state postsecondary review entity and gives the Commissioner of Education authority for rulemaking to implement the federal law.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-393) adds a fiscal note to the bill.
