LD 1781

An Act to Amend the Sea Urchin Harvesting and Licensing Laws and to Establish the Sea Urchin Fund

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

SUMMARY

LD 1781 proposed to shorten the sea urchin harvesting closed season from 3 months to 2 months. This bill also proposed to increase license fees and to dedicate the increase to a sea urchin resource conservation, research and enforcement fund. The bill also proposed to require that persons diving for sea urchins possess a scuba certification from a nationally recognized agency.

LD 1785 An Act Concerning Alewives

H-766

SUMMARY

LD 1785 increased from 24 hours to 72 hours the period of time that rivers or streams not managed under a lease agreement are closed to the taking of alewives.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-766) added a fiscal note to the bill.

LD 1827 An Act Concerning Authorization to Grow Certain Marine Species in Aquaculture

SUMMARY

LD 1827 authorizes the Department of Marine Resources to amend aquaculture leases in a manner that permits the aquaculture of species not permitted under the terms of the original lease.

LD 1871 An Act Concerning the Importation of Salmon

SUMMARY

LD 1871 repeals that provision of law that would have prohibited after July 1, 1995 the introduction into the waters of the State any fish raised in the state either from eggs or broodstock that originated in Icelandic, European or western North American waters. The bill retains the existing prohibition on the importation of Icelandic, European and western North American Atlantic Salmon, either live or as eggs.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-426) added a fiscal note to the bill.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" (S-433) eliminates the July 1, 1994 repeal of the provisions governing the salmon aquaculture monitoring and research fund. This amendment also adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause.
