All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act to Amend the Law Pertaining to the Appointment of a Guardian Ad Litem in Contested Proceedings

SUMMARY

The bill clarifies the court's discretionary authority to appoint a guardian ad litem. It provides guidelines to assist judges in deciding when to appoint a guardian. The bill requires the judge to specify the duties of the guardian, allows the admission into evidence of a guardian's report with certain conditions, provides immunity for court-appointed guardians and makes clear that the parties shall bear the expense if a guardian is appointed.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-498) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

An Act to Prohibit Excessive or Unnecessary Prescription of Drugs or Treatment by Health Care Professionals

SUMMARY

The bill would have made it a Class E crime for a health care professional to excessively prescribe drugs, treatment or diagnostic procedures.

An Act to Improve Methods of Dispute Resolution of the Maine Human Rights Commission

SUMMARY

This bill directs the Maine Human Rights Commission to provide for third-party neutral mediation as an alternative to the current methods of dispute resolution. The bill also directs the commission to set guidelines for the mediation process that would be in effect by January 1, 1995.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-497) removes the requirement that the commission establish third-party mediation but authorizes the commission to adopt rules for a third-party mediation program that would permit either party to voluntarily agree to pay the costs and that would be permit the commission to accept any funds the commission is able to obtain for this purpose. The Committee Amendment also adds a fiscal note.

An Act to Limit the Use of Force against Law Enforcement Officers Engaged in Searches or Seizures

SUMMARY

This bill would have provided that a person is not justified in using deadly force against a law enforcement officer engaged in a search or a seizure under certain circumstances even if the search or seizure turns out to be illegal.

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
