SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

CARRIED OVER	Bill carried over to Second Session
CON RES XXX	Chapter # of Constitutional Resolution passed by both Houses
CONF CMTE UNABLE TO AGREE	Committee of Conference unable to agree; bill died

SUMMARY

This bill prevents an employee or the spouse of an employee of a school administrative unit from being on a school board of another school administrative unit if both of the units are in the same school union and have the same superintendent of schools.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-218) restricts the application of the bill to school board members elected upon or after the effective date of the bill. School board members currently serving on a board are exempt from the requirement of the bill for the remainder of their present term.

Under this bill, if an operating school budget fails at 2 alternative voting referenda, then the budget must be submitted to a district budget meeting. The concept contained in this bill will be reconsidered during the second session of the 117th Legislature in conjunction with LD 880 which was carried over.
