SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill would have added recipients of social security benefits and retirement benefits to the list of people who have one year to repair their motor vehicles under the auto emissions testing program. The bill also would have allowed 180 days for repair of any motor vehicle.

SUMMARY

This bill repeals the Motor Vehicle Emission Inspection Program, immediately upon enactment.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-143) adds allocation sections and a fiscal note to the bill.

See also LD 716. Both LD 716 and LD 48 repeal the auto emissions inspection program. LD 48, an emergency bill, provided for immediate repeal of the testing requirement (effective April 28, 1995); LD 716, a citizen-initiated bill, effective September 29, 1995 was enacted to alleviate the need to send the legislation to referendum in the fall.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to immunize owners of shooting ranges from civil and criminal prosecution for matters relating to noise or noise pollution at the shooting range, as long as the shooting range operated in compliance with noise control laws or ordinances in effect when the shooting range was constructed.
