SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

Currently state law requires that a convenience store that is open 24 hours a day have a drop safe, no more than \$50 in cash between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. and a sign at the entrance of the store that states that the cash register contains less than \$50 between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

This bill adds to these requirements a 4th requirement for an alarm and a telephone within easy reach of the cashier.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-127) requires either a phone or an alarm and requires only that they be accessible to the employees.
