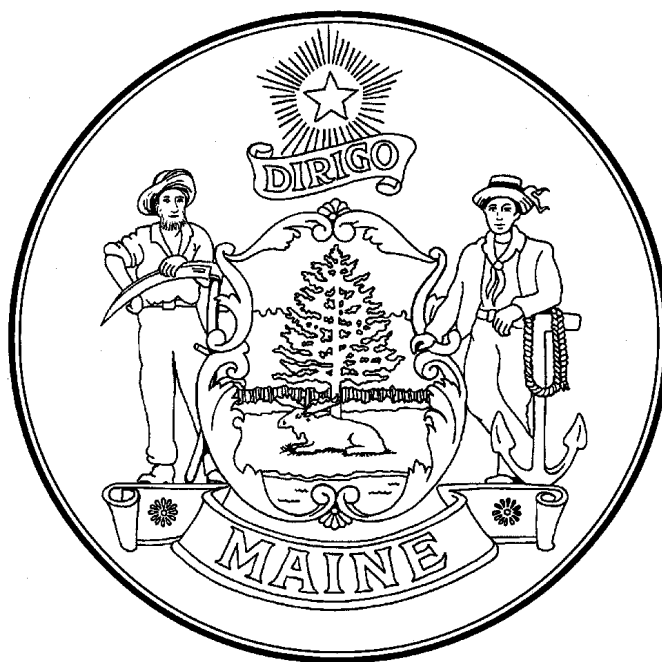

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE
THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

CARRIED OVER	<i>Bill carried over to Second Session</i>
CON RES XXX	<i>Chapter # of Constitutional Resolution passed by both Houses</i>
CONF CMTE UNABLE TO AGREE	<i>Committee of Conference unable to agree; bill died</i>

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**SUMMARY**

This resolve creates the Maine Council on Privatization, which is charged with examining ways in which State Government can use the private sector to deliver certain services currently being provided by the State. The council must submit its final report to the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives and report its findings, including any necessary legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government no later than February 1, 1996.

H-36

SUMMARY

This bill removes the restrictions on full-time deputies holding the municipal offices of selectman, city councilor or budget committee member.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-36) retains the removal of the restrictions on full-time deputies holding certain municipal offices contained in the original bill and clarifies that they may not hold any county office other than full-time deputy sheriff.
