SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

A person applying for a license as a pharmacist must, among other requirements, have a degree from a program accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education. To be eligible for licensure by reciprocity, a person must possess the qualifications that were in place in this State at the time that the person was initially licensed.

This bill waives the requirement for the degree from an accredited program for those applicants for licensure by reciprocity who in addition to the other requirements have practiced as a pharmacist for 5 years and have passed the examination of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-187) makes it discretionary for the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy to waive the accredited program requirement and requires that for it to be waived the applicant must have graduated from a college of pharmacy in this country prior to June 1, 1985 and have had the required 5 years experience in this country within the past 10 years.
