SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

This bill increases the number of members of the Loring Development Authority board of trustees from 11 members to 13. It also raises the number of members necessary for a quorum and limits the number of members who are from Aroostook County.

SUMMARY

This bill makes recreational vehicle dealers exempt from the Sunday sales prohibition.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-133) clarifies that it is motor homes that are exempted.

LD 236 An Act to Amend the Laws Governing Reciprocity in the PUBLIC 257 Licensure of Pharmacists

SUMMARY

A person applying for a license as a pharmacist must, among other requirements, have a degree from a program accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education. To be eligible for licensure by reciprocity, a person must possess the qualifications that were in place in this State at the time that the person was initially licensed.

This bill waives the requirement for the degree from an accredited program for those applicants for licensure by reciprocity who in addition to the other requirements have practiced as a pharmacist for 5 years and have passed the examination of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-187) makes it discretionary for the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy to waive the accredited program requirement and requires that for it to be waived the applicant must have graduated from a college of pharmacy in this country prior to June 1, 1985 and have had the required 5 years experience in this country within the past 10 years.

SUMMARY

This bill requires that the Office of Business Development coordinate its business attraction and

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information efforts with local municipalities.

The Committee determined that this is already a requirement.

LD 285 An Act Concerning Placement of Modular Homes PUBLIC 199

SPONSOR(S) CAREY COMMITTEE REPORT AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

SUMMARY

This bill requires that modular homes built to state construction standards must be allowed where other single-family dwellings are allowed. In doing so it brings this statute into agreement with 10 MRSA, Section 9042, subsection 3.

LD 309 An Act to Encourage Major Business Expansion in Maine PUBLIC 4

SUMMARY

This bill allows the Finance Authority of Maine to issue up to \$100,000,000 in revenue obligation securities relating to major business expansion projects, defined as projects costing more than \$5,000,000 and creating or retaining more than 100 jobs. The securities may be backed by capital reserve funds requiring appropriation of amounts necessary to refill the reserve if drawn upon to pay debt service on the bonds.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" (H-8) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" (H-9) strengthens the applicable standards to be used by the Finance Authority of Maine in reviewing the financial ability of an applicant to repay a loan and clarifies that applications under the program require a certificate of approval process giving competitors an opportunity to object to a project. The amendment further establishes a process and time frame within which any suit, claim or proceeding regarding issuance of bonds must be commenced in order to allow bonds to be sold to bondholders without the risk of a lawsuit being filed after the sale to bondholders.

SUMMARY

This bill allows accountants when establishing a practice to use any type of business entity or combination of business entities recognized by the State.
