SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill establishes an electronic benefit delivery program for the delivery of benefits by automated means to recipients of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children, food stamp, Medicaid and the Women, Infants and Children Special Supplemental Food programs. This bill enables program recipients to use encoded cards to withdraw benefits from automated teller and point of service machines on a periodic basis.

The bill requires the Department of Human Services to apply for a waiver to establish the electronic benefit delivery program and requires that program to be implemented within 90 days of receipt of the waiver.

The bill requires a report by January 1, 1996, by the Department of Human Services to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources on progress in implementing the program.

This bill was carried over to the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature.

The bill requires a report by January 1, 1996 from the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources on progress in implementing the program.
