## SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

#### AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to amend the laws governing sewer extensions as follows.

- 1. It proposed to require that a sanitary district first acquire certain assurances from the municipal officers of each municipality through which a sewer line passes, and from the municipality from which the line originates.
- 2. It proposed to require the municipal officers of each affected municipality to hold a hearing on a proposed sewer line extension and issue a written decision within 7 days of the hearing.
- 3. It proposed to provide new definitions of "sewer service" and "sewer line extension."
