SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

An Act Concerning Juveniles Hunting without Adult Supervision

SUMMARY

This bill requires that a person who holds a resident junior hunting license and who is between the ages of 10 and 15 may only hunt while in the presence and under the supervision of an adult.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-67) adds a fiscal note to the bill.

An Act to Require That Additions to the Endangered Species List Be Approved by the Legislature

SUMMARY

This bill repeals the authority of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to designate a species as endangered or threatened and enacts into law the existing list of endangered and threatened species. The bill also requires the Commissioner to recommend changes to the statutory list of endangered and threatened species if any of the standards under 12 MRSA, section 7753, subsection 1 apply to that species.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-248) makes technical corrections to the bill and strikes a provision in the bill that proposed to allow the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to "delete" a species from the statutory list.

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" (S-274) requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to provide for public notice and public comment on proposed recommendations for changes in the list of endangered or threatened species. That public notice and public hearing must be conducted according to the provisions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act that apply to agency rule-making activities. This amendment removes the emergency preamble and emergency clause from the bill and states that the Legislature may not change the list of endangered or threatened species except upon the recommendation of the commissioner.
