SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill prohibited partisan legislative employees from participating in campaigns during working hours. It also restricted all legislative employees from using equipment for anything other than work-related matters and prohibited the display of campaign materials for current candidates.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-68) corrected an erroneous headnote in the bill that designated partisan employees as Legislative Council employees, clarified that legislative employees were not permitted to use legislative equipment and resources for campaign purposes and deleted the section that prohibited campaign materials in the State House. It also added a fiscal note to the bill.

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (S-86) was presented on behalf of the Committee on Bills in Second Reading to correct an amending clause.
