SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill abolishes the current Cumberland County Budget Advisory Committee and replaces it with the Cumberland County Budget Committee. The new budget committee, working in conjunction with the county commissioners, is responsible for developing the annual county budget. The bill establishes a collaborative process between the commissioners and the committee in reviewing department requests, sharing budgetary information and approving a final budget. The budget approved by the budget committee is final unless changed by the county commissioners by unanimous vote. The membership, qualifications, terms and procedures of the new budget committee are similar to those of the old budget advisory committee. The bill contains transition provisions to guide implementation. If Cumberland County establishes a county manager style of government, the Cumberland County Budget Committee is terminated.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-530) replaces the bill. It establishes the position of Cumberland County manager and temporarily abolishes the current Cumberland County Budget Advisory Committee. Until a county manager is hired, not later than January 1, 1996, the Cumberland County Budget Committee approves the county budget, subject only to a unanimous override by the county commissioners. After the county manager is hired, the budget committee's recommended budget may be overridden by a majority vote of the county commissioners. The county manager is hired by the county commissioners and works under their direction in executing the policy directives of the county commissioners and managing the day-to-day operations of county government, including preparation of the proposed county budget. The amendment contains transition provisions to guide implementation. The amendment also adds a mandate preamble, an emergency preamble, an emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" TO COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-586) clarifies the process for filing a vacancy on the Budget Advisory Committee.

SUMMARY

This resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to reduce the size of the House of Representatives from 151 members to 99 members and the size of the Senate from no more than 35 members to 33 members. The redistricting will be done in 2003 and the reduction in size of the bodies takes effect in 2005.

SUMMARY

This bill requires a formal affirmative vote of the majority of the municipal officers before a municipal treasurer can disburse money.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-82) adds a mandate preamble and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
