SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

Under existing law, a municipal clerk serving as chair of the board of voter registration who did not nominate a successor could not be removed by the municipal officers, regardless of the clerk's conduct in office on the board. This bill corrected the problem and allowed the municipal officers to remove a clerk from the board for cause. The bill also permitted a clerk who was appointed as chair to serve for their entire tenure as clerk, unless removed as a board member, and exempted the clerk from the chair's usual 4-year term.
