SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION BEFORE THE JOINT STANDING COMMITTEES

AUGUST 1995

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries. The publication, <u>History and Final Disposition of Legislative Documents</u>, is helpful in determining to which committee any particular bill was referred.

In this document, the committee report or reports, the prime sponsor for each bill and the lead co-sponsor in each house if one has been designated are listed below each bill title. All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number, together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various categories of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill recognizes the new community consent decree that replaced the Pineland Consent Decree and gives oversight responsibility for all persons in this State with mental retardation or autism to the Consumer Advisory Board.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-156) accomplishes the following.

- 1. It changes an error in a date in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-B, section 1216, subsection 1.
- 2. It restricts the persons who may receive services to clients of the Division of Mental Retardation.
- 3. It restricts access to areas, records and personnel of institutions, facilities, agencies and other providers administered by the Division of Mental Retardation or when any client of the division resides or participates in work or in a program.
